

CHIPPEWA DESIGN LAB:

A Creative Space for Student Innovation





A kemos 7th and 8th grade students are enjoying a variety of brand-new design equipment this fall. The Chippewa Design Lab, located in 7th grade science teacher Mark Tomczak's classroom, contains a 3D printer, vinyl cutter, color printer, several single-board computers, and three portable sewing machines. This equipment is being used in a new Chippewa elective called "Design Thinking," in which students learn the elements of good design, are taught how to safely use the equipment, and are then encouraged to use their imaginations to create their own projects.

Jessa is creating a colorful cloth bag that will hang from her bed frame. She's using one of the sewing machines to stitch fabric pieces together into a bag of her own design. She will then attach the bag to the bed frame using a plastic hook that she created with the 3D printer. She had never used either type of

machine before and is looking forward to using her finished project. Owen designed a decal using software on his district-supplied learning device (laptop computer). He then used the vinyl cutter to print the decal and decorated his device with his own personal logo. John is using the 3D printer to print a nosecone for a rocket. He downloaded the cone's design from the Internet but will use his own ideas to create the rocket body and parachute system. The vinyl cutter will help him personalize his rocket with decals. He expects the project to take all trimester and will probably involve some trial-and-error, an important part of the design process. "Mistakes are necessary in any part of

learning because they lay the foundation for success. Failing at something is the first step to being great at it," advises Mr. Tomczak.

The Chippewa Design Lab will also be used by students in the Science Olympiad after-school club and is open to other students who have been trained on the equipment. Eric, an 8th grade student, has used the 3D printer to help him create the plastic nosecone and fins for a rocket project he worked on at home with his dad. After launching their initial design, they made a few adjustments to improve performance. Eric's dad reports, "It flew way, way up until we lost sight of it. After the timed delay, the parachute charge ejected and we saw a puff of smoke. Based on the motor and design, it should have flown somewhere between 1,200 and 1,500 feet high. This is the best rocket we've made!"

"We know our students have the imagination and creativity to visualize amazing projects," says OEF Chair Martha Hentz. "This new equipment gives them the tools to make those ideas come to life." The Okemos Education Foundation received a grant from the Dart Foundation to purchase the equipment and supplies for the Chippewa Design Lab.

OTHER DESIGN OPPORTUNITIES

Chippewa students also have access to the "CMS Library Makerspace," which contains rotating hands-on activities for students in the areas of art, technology, science, and coding. In addition, the Chippewa Parent Group purchased a 3D printer that is part of the Chippewa Design Lab.

HISTORY WAS **ALIVE AT OHS ON** 4/19/2016

Last spring, the Okemos Education Foundation presented a panel discussion about the 1955 murder of Emmett Till, one of the pivotal events that sparked the American Civil Rights Movement. The Legacy of Emmett Till: Understanding History from Four Perspectives featured guest speakers including Emmett Till's cousin, Wheeler Parker Ir., who was an eye witness to the events, author and historian Dr. Chris Crowe, FBI agent Dale Killinger who reopened the case in 2005, and MSU English and African American Studies professor Dr. Tamara Butler. The program was experienced by every Okemos High School student during the school day and by over 500 community members who attended the evening session. Author/Illustrator Laurie Keller visits Okemos Schools



ichigan author/illustrator Laurie Keller visited Okemos elementary schools for "March is Reading Month." Students were already familiar with Keller's work, since her popular title **Do Unto Otters: A Book About Manners** is a 2015 *Michigan Reads! Featured Title.* Keller shared how she develops story ideas and the importance of re-writing and editing. Keller ended her programs by giving step-bystep instructions on how to draw two of her beloved characters: the otter and Arnie the Doughnut. Students drew along with her and took home their very own versions of her characters.

The Okemos Education Foundation partners with Horizon Bank each spring to bring a different author to Okemos elementary students. "When I was young," Keller told the audience, "I loved writing stories and drawing pictures, but I never realized that you could do this for a living." This visiting author program helps inspire young students to pursue their own passions in creative writing and drawing, and helps them imagine that they, too, can someday have their work published. Grant Highlights

The Okemos Education Foundation approved funding for 44 grants last year. Grant requests came from every building and every grade level in the district and focused on many different academic areas. The complete list of approved grants can be found on our website (www.oefsite.org/grants).

Fit Desks - Chippewa

Seventh grade teacher Tom Hopper received an OEF grant to purchase 3 "Fit Desks," tall desks equipped with bicycle pedals to help kids expend some energy as they sit in class. Students commented that they like the desks because they "sit up higher,"



are "more comfortable," "different," and they "keep you active while working so you don't get off task." One student told OEF Chair Martha Hentz, "I don't get in trouble as much" when he uses a Fit Desk, because "I can focus on my work." The Chippewa Parent Group also purchased a Fit Desk for the building.

Math Learning Materials – Commitment to Excellence Award Grant

Chippewa teacher Lee Ballor received an OEF Commitment to Excellence Award in 2013 for her outstanding teaching. Recipients



of this award each receive a \$1,000 grant to "support their continued contributions to education," which is interpreted in a variety of ways by recipients. Some purchase technology

for their classrooms, some spend the grant on educational experiences, such as a guest speaker for their classroom or continuing education for themselves, while other recipients purchase classroom supplies. Ms. Ballor purchased a variety of educational supplies to help her math students, including math manipulatives as shown in the photo.

OHS Author Visit



Author Kristine Brickey (Flowers for Rodney; They Said She Was Crazy) visited OHS last spring, sharing her insight with students about the writing process and about suicide prevention. Brickey, who is also a Mason 8th grade teacher, lost her 16-year-old son 6 years ago. Thank you, OHS Librarian Sandy Fields and the OHS English Department for bringing Brickey to our students. The Okemos Education Foundation funded a portion of Brickey's visit through the OEF Micro Grant program.

The Art Memory Project - OHS



OHS art teacher Rebecca Butler received an OEF Micro Grant last year to fund The Art Memory Project, an opportunity for her students to create special portraits of orphaned children. Organizers of the project send photographers to take photos of children at orphanages in various countries (Butler's class was paired with a group from Bolivia). These photos are sent to art students like Butler's

who create special portraits from the photos. The portraits are then delivered back to the children, who often have very few childhood keepsakes. Ms. Butler's students were sent a heartwarming video of the children receiving their portraits. "I love this project. Thank you!" says Butler.



WORLD LANGUAGE CLUB - OHS

"This year we focused on learning about different cultures and had guest speakers from within OHS share their culture with our club. We also celebrated the Day of the Dead, hosted the Mardi Gras Carnival Float competition, learned how to merengue dance, and learned how to play games from around the world. 


A Message from OEF Board Chair **Martha Hentz**
